Don't Leave Christ Out!

Where has Christ gone? The simple answer is, "nowhere". He is always there right beside us, but we tend to forget in our busy lives. We have appointments, deadlines to meet, start and stop times, functions, events, parties, hobbies, kids, parents, family, and friends to tend to. Most of the time our lives are focused on everything in the world and we forget that Christ is always right there with us.

More recently in our church services at Faith, you may have noticed a change in the Apostles' Creed. In the 3rd Article of the Creed, we used to say "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church". We now say, "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Christian Church". In Luther's Small Catechism it is written "Christian Church" not catholic Church. So, how did we ever get to saying catholic Church and why did we only recently change this back to "Christian Church"?

At the beginning of October this year, Pastor Trisha, Beth George (Church Council President), and I attended the National LCMC Annual Gathering in St. Charles, Missouri. At the worship services during the Gathering the congregation would say the Apostles' Creed. In the creed the LCMC used "Christian Church" not catholic Church. Since we are part of the LCMC and no longer ELCA (and haven't been for years) we decided that we should probably follow what the LCMC is doing and not what ELCA had left us doing. So, now to

the question of "how did we ever start saying catholic instead of Christian?

Beginning in the 1950s Faith used a Red Lutheran Churches Service Book and Hymnal. In that Red Hymnal, the Apostles' Creed says "Christian Church" not catholic Church. In 1978 the Green Hymnal was published that we at Faith currently have and in our pews. This Green Hymnal "Lutheran Book of Worship" was driven by the Lutheran Church in America, Philadelphia and was done so in collaboration with The American Lutheran Church, The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Canada, and The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. A large portion of the collaboration from the other churches, outside of the Lutheran Church in America, was for the writing and arranging of the hymns done by professors, doctors, and professionals of music. Most Lutheran churches purchased a small limited number of the hymnals to mainly use for their choirs' use and to print or project an occasional new song to be added to a service. However, in whole the Green Hymnal was highly rejected by many of the Lutheran Churches and never placed in the pews due to the words "catholic Church" that had replaced "Christian Church" in the Creeds. It was in fact, the Green hymnal that created this change for those churches that placed the hymnal in the pews and followed it's Worships of Service.

As we approach Christmas, we should also remember not to leave Christ out of Christmas. You will see signs that say Merry Xmas, Happy Holidays, and Seasons Greetings. Christ is nowhere to be found in those signs and sayings. Christ is the Reason for the Season! There is no Christmas without Christ!

We are indeed Christians. We do follow Christ. He is always with and all around us. He is there, each and every day of our lives and continues to walk by our side. Don't forget He is there! Include Christ in Everything You Do!

These are all building maintenance issues that needed taken care of to keep our church feeling and looking better.

Nurse's Corner

Our First Defense Against Illness



I remember clearly placing my fingerprint in the agar of the petri dish in my microbiology class I was taking for my nursing degree. A few days later, my classmates and I examined our samples. It was shocking to see the amount of "growth" in our dishes—evidence of the germs we unknowingly carried on our hands.

While our faith is all about believing in what we cannot see, that experiment changed my perspective when it comes to hand hygiene: Seeing IS believing. Perhaps that is why I am a regular "hand-washer" now!

Handwashing is our FIRST defense against illness.

Since we are going into the season of colds, flu, RSV and yes, Covid—it's still out there, folks—it is time to refresh our minds about the importance of clean hands.

- Avoid touching the "T" zone of your face: the eyes, nose, and mouth. These are portals of entry for germs into your body.
- Wash your hands often, especially before eating and after using the bathroom.
- Wash your hands for a full 20 seconds or longer.
- Take advantage of sanitizing gels and wipes now available at many stores and wipe down your shopping cart handle. The person before you may have had a cold or the flu.
- When you've been out in public, wash your hands as soon as possible, avoiding the "T" zone until you do. If you use a public restroom, use a paper towel to turn off the water and to open the door when you leave.
- If you are sick, <u>stay home</u> to prevent the spread of your illness to others.
- Don't cough or sneeze into your hands—use the sleeve of your shirt or a tissue.

Bookkeeper's Corner

As we approach the end of 2023, I thought the congregation might be interested in where our church is financially. The answer is... **not very encouraging**. Below are our balances in several major areas on a **Year-to-Date** basis through the end of November.

Rather than me trying to explain all these numbers, let me just state a few facts to hopefully put everything in perspective:

- The results above show a deficit (expenses exceed income) of \$65,000 as of the end of November.
- Compared to past years, having a deficit at this point in time is not unusual, but the deficit is generally in the neighborhood of \$20,000 to \$30,000, not \$65,000.
- The first two items in the "Income" section clearly show that our committed income (pledges) is nearly \$31,000 below what was budgeted.
- In the "Expense" section, the Total Expense is \$53,500 over budget and that \$44,000 of this is due to the first items in Expense Salary & Benefits and Property.
- Having Total Expenses over budget is not necessarily bad if you have extra (unbudgeted) income to cover the unbudgeted expenses. In the Other category in the Income section, the church had nearly \$19,000 of

- extra income. This offsets part of the \$53,500 deficit, but certainly not all of it.
- The end result is that about half of the \$65,000 deficit is due to insufficient income and half is due to over spending.
- In all but one year in the past six, the church's December results were so good that the church not only made up the deficit, but ended up with a profit.

So what does all this boil down to? To break even for this year, the church must have enough income in December to cover December expenses plus an extra \$65,000 in income to catch up for the previous 11 months deficit. Is that possible? If so, it's up to all of us!
